⇒ 16 October 2014: Astrid Volckaert participated in the CERAMITEC Roundtable on refractories, organised in Höhr-Grenzhausen, Germany, in preparation of the CERAMITEC 2015 Fair on 20-23 October 2015. The meeting discussed the topic: "Hidden Champions in their User Industries Market Trends + Innovation Potentials in Europe". Click here to see a video of the event.



- ⇒ 22-23 October 2014: The EU-funded ReStaR project held its second meeting at the premises of ICAR in Moncel-lès-Lunéville, France. The project is now halfway to being finished in October 2015.
- ⇒ 27 October 2014: The European Commission adopted the Decision determining the list of sectors exposed to significant risk of carbon leakage under the EU Emissions Trading System (ETS) for the period 2015-2019. The refractories sector was included in the list as its trade intensity is above 30%.
- ⇒ 27 November 2014: 15 European industry associations signed a joint document highlighting the socioeconomic implications of the inclusion of AI (Zr) Refractory Ceramic Fibres (RCF) on the REACH Annex XIV list (requesting authorisation). The European Commission is analysing the situation in greater detail. A decision will be taken by Member States in the course of 2015.
- ⇒ 4 December 2014: The INTA Committee held a public hearing on how to effectively break the link between mineral extraction and conflict, while at the same time promote legitimate trade in the interest of economic development. INTA members assessed the Commission's proposals to encourage companies high in the supply chain to source minerals and gold responsibly from conflict areas. Speakers included OECD experts, upstream and downstream business representatives, think tanks and civil society organisations from Africa and Europe.
- ⇒ 27-29 May 2015: The 2015 PRE Congress will be held at the Point Hotel Barbaros in Istanbul, hosted by SEREF, the Turkish Ceramic and Refractories Manufacturers Association.
